



Proposed Amendment for Treasure Coast Zone, LWML, ByLaws:

The following Amendments are proposed to the Treasure Coast Zone, Florida-Georgia District, Lutheran Women's Missionary League ByLaws:

The following is hereby added to Article IV, Meetings, Section 1, Item B:

A two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Executive Committee shall decide, and the vote may be taken by mail or electronic messaging. In the event the rally is not held, the Executive Committee shall have the authority to plan procedures for conducting the routine rally business.

The following is hereby added to Article IV, Meetings, Section 1 Item C:

The President or chair of the committee proposing to meet by electronic means shall obtain suitable electronic meeting date from an acceptable electronic meeting facilitator and, when ascertained, shall notify the Board, committee and/or members of the date, time, and access information for the meeting at least two weeks prior to the proposed electronic meeting date.

Any documentation or resolutions for presentation at the electronic meeting shall be sent to the facilitator for the electronic meeting, the President or chair of the committee meeting, the secretary for the meeting, and other board or committee members at least one week prior to the meeting to allow sufficient time for review.

The Board, committee members and members attending the meeting via electronic means or telephone shall constitute a quorum.

Article VII, Nominations and Elections, Section 4 is hereby amended to read:

- A. In case of emergency or time sensitivity as determined by the President or Vice President, voting by mail, by telephone or by electronic communications may be utilized by the Board of Directors, committee, or members, as appropriate. If voting is in person or by teleconferencing visual means, nominations may take place from the floor, provided the nominee has consented to serve if elected.
- B. The issue for vote shall be sent to the voting parties with clear indication of when the voting will close and to whom the responses should be sent.
- C. The Board of Directors, committee members or members responding to the voting by mail, by telephone or by electronic communications shall constitute a quorum.
- D. Final voting results shall be sent to all members of the voting parties, as appropriate.
- E. All communications regarding the vote shall be filed with the Zone Secretary along with a summary of the voting.


